Natural resources have been priced too low.



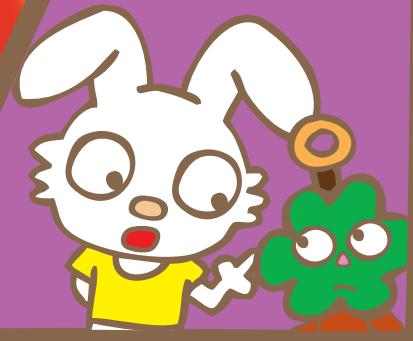
It is called debt-for-nature.



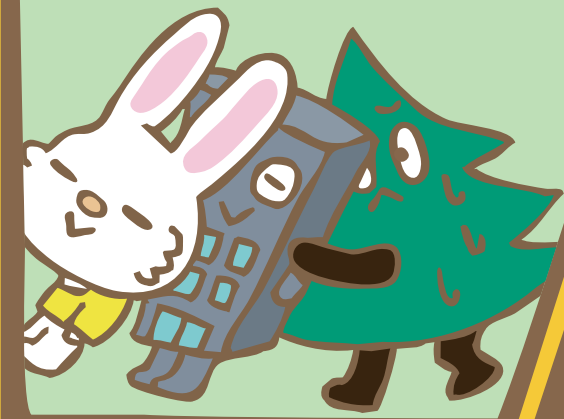
The Earth is ill because of pollution and global warming. And I am trying to cure it.



What are the causes of the illness?

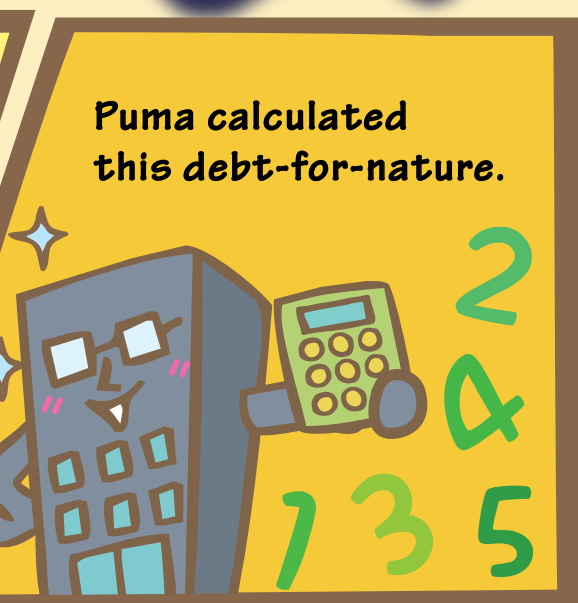
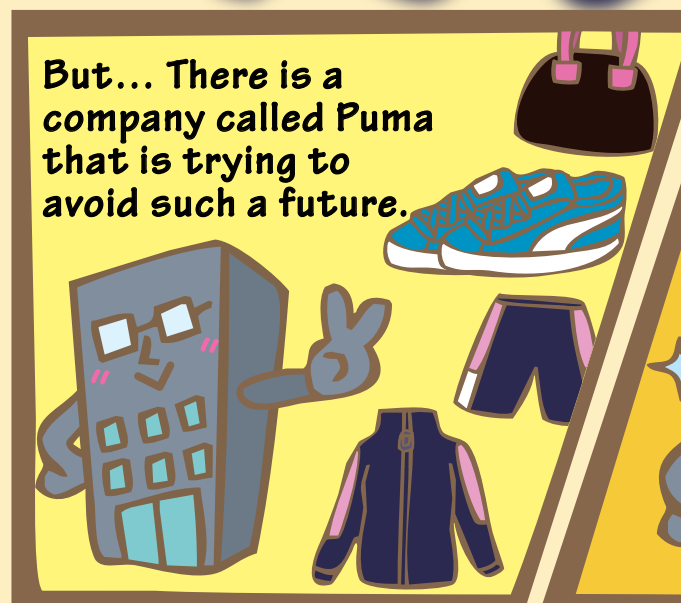
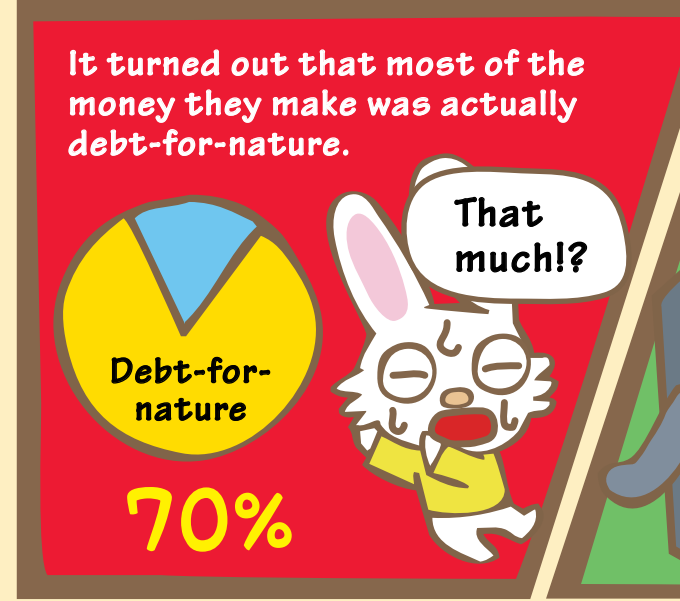


Humans and society are supported by nature.

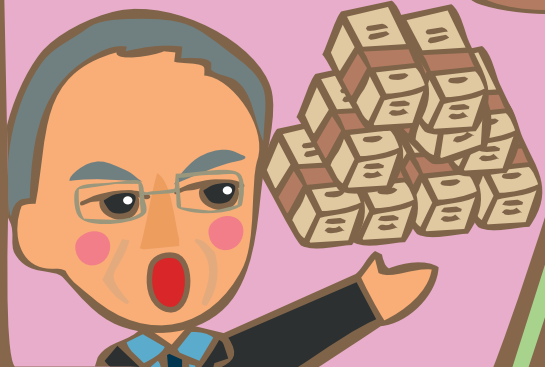


We need natural resources to live.

Thank you Mr. Pavan. Please make sure that the Earth gets well!

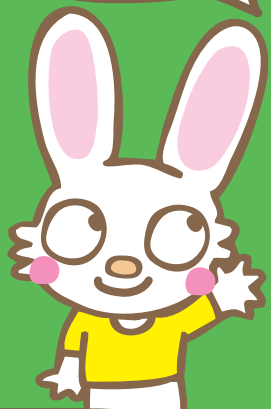


Welcome back! How was it?

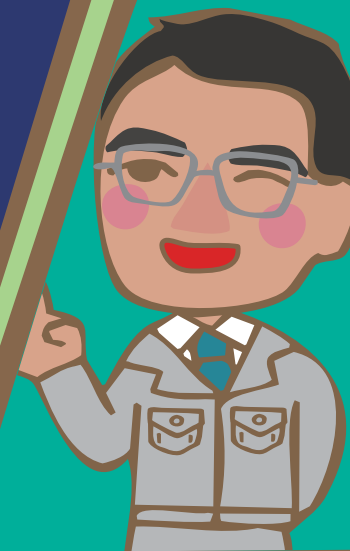

The Earth is crying because of us.



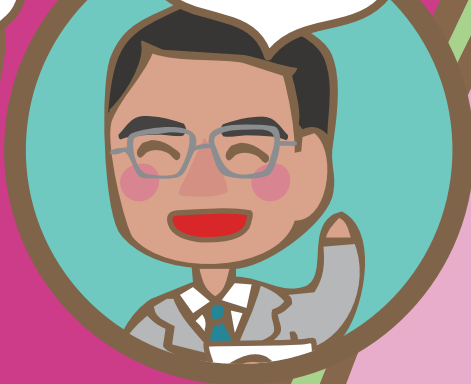

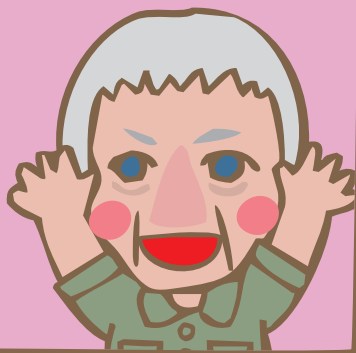

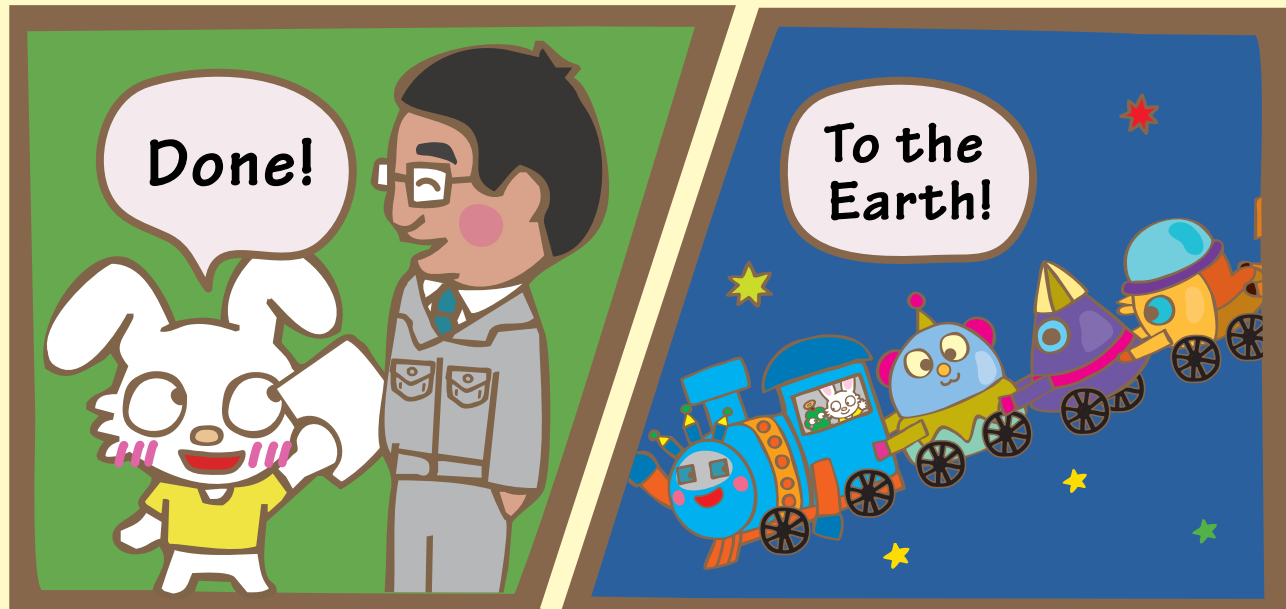


Dear Dr. Mohri, We had been thinking that the resources and animals on the Earth are given, but now we know that was wrong. It is important that we support the Earth as well.

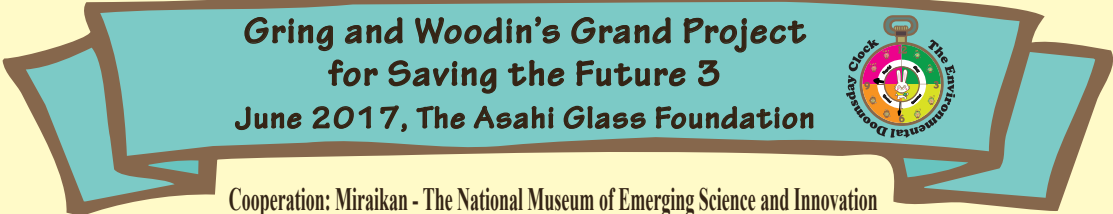
